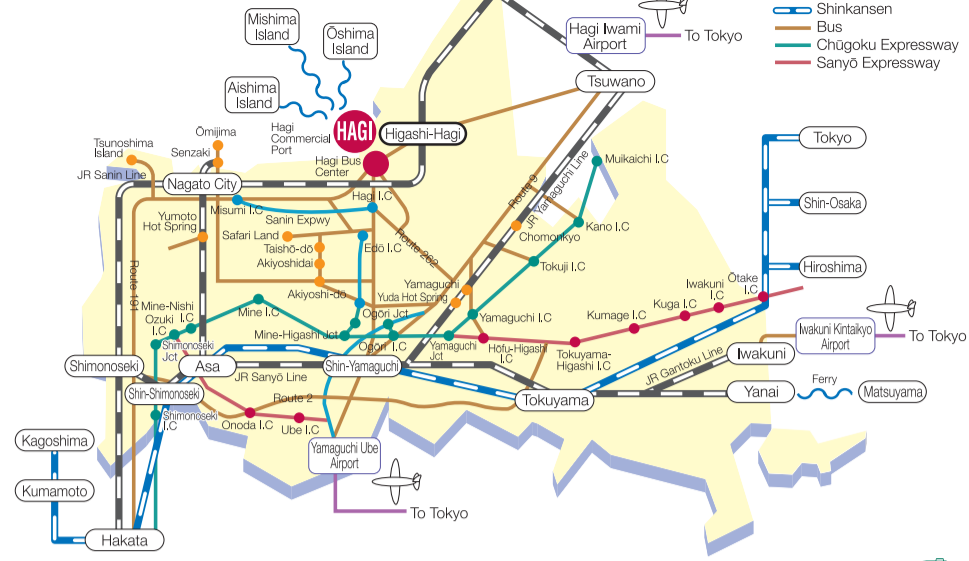


ACCESS INFORMATION

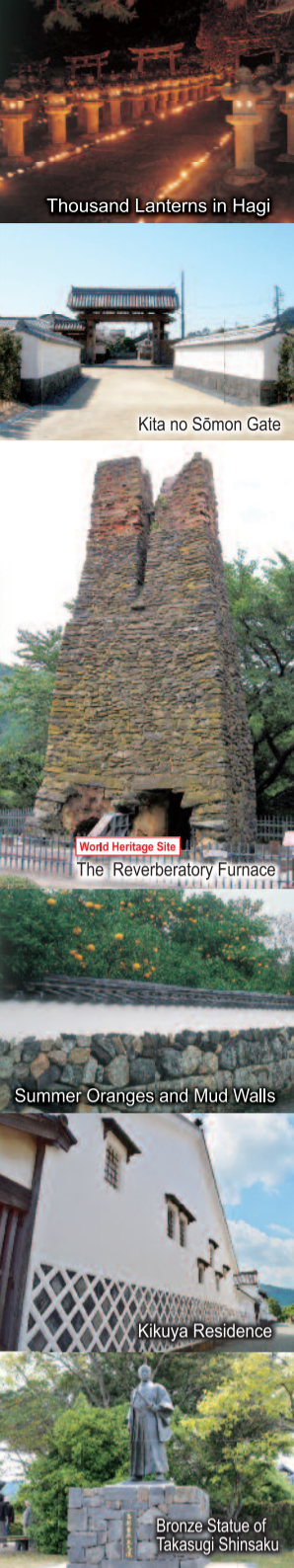
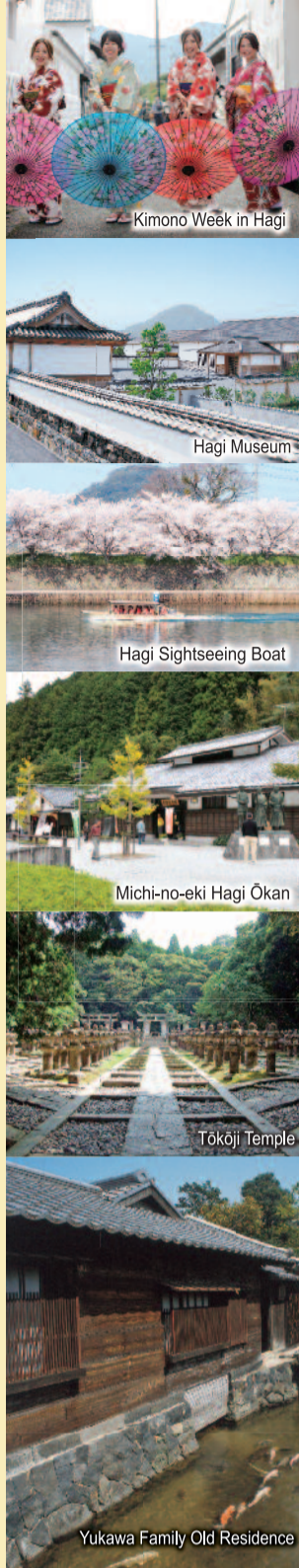

Birthplace of Yoshida Shōin
 Yoshida Shōin was born in 1830. The original house is a small thatched house dating from 1854. The larger villa was built in Tokyo in 1907, and one part of it was subsequently reconstructed at its present location, next to the Former Residence.

World Heritage Site
 The private school led by Yoshida Shōin for approximately 1 year, 1 month. Many of the graves of the Mori lords registered as Important Cultural Properties. The architecture, the main gate and other features are an outstanding example of Ōbaku Zen from the 2nd generation, and every subsequent odd numbered lord up until the 11th are situated in the temple grounds.



Around Shōin Shrine

Hagi Uragami Museum
 Built to house the donated collection of Hagi local, Uragami Toshio. The collection includes wood block prints by Utagawa Hiroshige and Katsushika Hokusai.

Hagi Museum
 Documents and exhibits relating to the industry, history, nature and folk culture of Hagi are displayed. Many exhibits relating to the life of Takasugi Shinsaku are also exhibited.



Around the Ruins of Hagi Castle



Kita no Sōmon Gate
 A Nationally Designated Important Cultural Property, the Castle Town area remains in such perfect condition that Edo period maps can still be used to walk around the city. Kikuya Alley, Iseya Alley and Edoya Alley still remain much as they used to look.



Hagi Museum
 Documents and exhibits relating to the industry, history, nature and folk culture of Hagi are displayed. Many exhibits relating to the life of Takasugi Shinsaku are also exhibited.

Map of the Hagi Castle Town Area

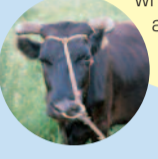

Former Residence of Kido Takayoshi, Former Aoki Shūsuke Residence, Yukawa Family Old Residence, Former Residence of Katsura Tarō, Itō Hirobumi Second Residence, Former Kubota Family Residence, Kuchiba Family Residence, Former Tanaka Second Residence and Asa Mōri Residence cost ¥100 per visitor (free to under preschool children).
◇When included with a joint ticket for Shizuki Park, Asa Mōri Residence costs ¥220.

Mishima Island
Situated approximately 45km off Hagi in the Sea of Japan. Mishima is home to the Mishima-ushi, thought to be the oldest breed of cow in Japan, and the Mishima tortoise, both of which have been designated as National Monuments.



World Heritage Site

a Ebisugahana Shipyard



The remains of the shipyard created for the construction of warships by the Hagi (Chōshū) domain. In the late Edo period, 2 Western-style warships constructed here were launched.

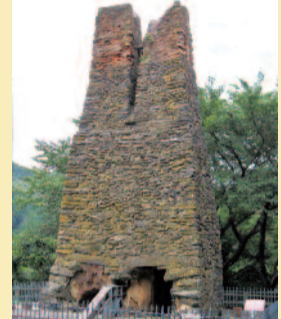
b Mount. Kasayama Camellia Grove



A grove of approximately 25,000 *Camellia Japonica*. A camellia festival is held for one month every year from mid-February.

c Hagi Reverberatory Furnace



A metallurgical furnace invented in Europe. There are only three such sites in all Japan, and as such, these remains are very significant.

d Former Yamanaka Family Residence



A large townhouse built in the Edo period. The Hamasaki district was designated a Preservation District for Groups of Traditional Buildings in 2001.

e Yukawa Family Old Residence



A samurai residence situated along the Aibagawa River. The water from the river was used in various ways inside such houses.

f Michi-no-Eki Hagi Sea Mart



Local Hagi residents enjoy shopping at this market facility. Locally-sourced seasonal products are on sale, and the market is particularly famous for fish.

g Michi-no-Eki Hagi Ōkan



Specialty local products and fresh vegetables can be bought here. The restaurant uses locally-sourced ingredients in their dishes.

Hagi Sightseeing Boat (Hagi Hakkei Yūransen)

Enjoy the Hagi scenery by boat. The course takes 40 minutes, with an explanation by the captain (in Japanese).

World Heritage Site i The Ruins of Hagi Castle · Shizuki Park Former Site of Hagi Castle (Shizuki Park)

Hagi Castle was built in 1604 by Mōri Terumoto. It was dismantled in 1874, but part of the moat and the stone base on which the castle once stood can still be seen today.



World Heritage Site h Horiuchi kaimagari

A particular twisting road found only in the castle town area. The road's surface has been laid in keeping with the Edo period scenery.
